### **Information from Social Security, A new "twist" in the law may help your Mom:**

The following information was provided by Everett M. Lo, Social Security Administration's Regional Public Affairs Office in the New York Region. "If your mother, or any special woman in your life, is covered by Medicare and has limited income and resources, she may be eligible for extra help to pay her monthly premiums, annual deductibles, and prescription co-payments. The extra help is worth an average of \$3,900 per year." The church has been given more information on this and if you are interested, you can find a handout the large wooden table near Barnwell Hall or get the information from the church office.
