Board of World Fellowship Update – Summer Programs

THE ESL PROGRAM. The Summer Teaching Assistant Program at Bishop Francis Center for Immigration that was funded by a BWF grant. This program involves four student participants two each from Summit High School and Malcolm X. Shabazz High School in Newark helping with the teaching duties in the English as a Second Language Program (ESL) along with Rosemarie Gelber and Tom Cummins. All four of the teaching assistants are bright, highly motivated and engaging, each bringing a very different perspective to the Program. The ESL students are delighted to have much more one-on-one time, and to engage with a variety of interested Americans each day of class. The student teachers are getting their eyes opened to something new every day. They hear stories about the reality of life in other countries. Besides serving as teaching assistants, the duties include participating with the ESL students in field trips to local museums and government offices to learn about American culture and government. Recently, the teaching assistants and the ESL students to went to Newark City Hall, where we visited Mayor Ras Baraka's office (he was not available), the Municipal Council Chambers (lots of selfies taken behind the speaker's platform!) and met with the Deputy responsible for connecting Newark with people from other nations. This afforded an opportunity to educate everyone about how government works in the U.S. It also was an opportunity for both sets of students to see people of color in leadership positions and to learn that those people can be accessible to them.

THE RISE PROGRAM. The BWF grant to the RISE Program at Drew University is providing support for Hailey Stine's participation in our summer research program. Hailey is a rising senior from Clinton, NJ who is majoring in biology. (She is also a star on the women's basketball team.) Her research project involves the study of a potentially useful and novel antibiotic known as kibdelomycin. Jon Kettenring is one of the senior supervising scientists in this Program. The importance of projects such as this is underscored by the world-wide shortage of new antibiotics and the declining effectiveness of many current ones.

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
