**SOS Donation Update:** Last April, the Church donated \$1,500 in SOS funds to the Young Center for Immigrant Children's Rights after CBS News reported on the group's success reuniting Junior, age 21 with his younger brother Andy, 8, for whom he was the sole caretaker in Honduras after their six-month separation. In August, the YCICR's lawyers and child welfare professionals collaborated with local helpers to aid the unsupervised children of hundreds of plant workers in Mississippi who were detained on immigration grounds. In Sept., the Center joined other advocates in an amicus brief opposing regulatory changes that would end decades of protection for vulnerable children.
